

Inter-Handler Transfer Report

Handlers transferring pistachios to another handler within the production area shall complete this form for submission to the Administrative Committee for Pistachios (ACP). The ACP uses this report to track compliance with FMO §983.150 (aflatoxin regulations) and prevent duplication of reported shipments. Inter-handler transfers are also reported by transferring and receiving handlers on line 5 of ACP-7 (Monthly Inventory/Shipments Report).
